

Our National Medal of Honor Leadership & Education Center and programs will:

- Tell the dramatic, inspirational stories of ordinary people thrust into extraordinary moments. How they responded reflects how they were prepared and why their values mattered then (and matter still).
- Provide a broader understanding of citizenship over self, overcoming adversity, and making crucial decisions in critical moments.
- Incorporate character development programming, including leadership certification programs, special events, curated exhibits, online classes, and more.
- Encourage timeless explorations of ethical decision making and applying Medal of Honor experiences into our present contexts of business, healthcare, education, and more.

The challenges and opportunities that await us will determine what kind of life, communities, institutions, and global role—what kind of America—we will build for the future.

A STRONG FOUNDATION UPON WHICH TO BUILD

We're not starting from zero. The Congressional Medal of Honor Society (CMOHS) is already actively committed to education and outreach - addressing resiliency, educating America's youth, and reaching our military, veteran, and business communities. They sponsor character development programs, the Medal of Honor Museum, and Citizen Honors Awards. Lessons and activities focus on wide ranging subjects to show how ordinary people can make a difference. To date, more than 20,000 teachers have been trained to administer these vital programs nationwide.

These continued efforts are critically important, but the challenge before us exceeds the Society's current resources. The solution must be thoughtful and proportionate.

COLLABORATIVE EDUCATIONAL VENTURES


We seek to complement the work of the CMOHS by collaborating with key faculty and organizations to offer various types of educational programs and experiences.



Second floor educational spaces, green room, archives, and administrative offices for both the Congressional Medal of Honor Society and National Medal of Honor Leadership & Education Center




IMMERSIVE EXHIBITS

TO INSPIRE, EDUCATE, HONOR AND UNITE



We're off to a promising start:

- Our future location is ideally situated at Patriots Point on waterfront property. It's close to collaborative assets such as the USS Yorktown, Fort Sumter and the city of Charleston.
- The National Medal of Honor Society will have expanded archival and office space to enhance educational programs, veterans' resources, and research.
- A world-class Congressional National Medal of Honor Museum will become the heart of the new Center to attract and inspire visitors from across America.
- Discussions are already underway with potential partners in higher education and industry to partner in collaborative classes, symposia, programs, and events.
- In a powerful endorsement of our vision and potential, we've already received preliminary 'seed' funding pledges from municipal, county, state entities, and individuals.

Building a National Medal of Honor Leadership & Education Center is a thrilling endeavor. The \$75 million in public and private philanthropic support will fund construction, exhibits, the Congressional Medal of Honor Society headquarters and archives, and the National Medal of Honor Leadership and Education Center. Our fundraising efforts will also provide seed funding for the first five years of operations.

CITIZENSHIP

HOW DONOR FUNDING WILL BE ALLOCATED:

Public and private investment funding will be allocated in three critical areas of importance:

- 1. Education
- 2. Construction and Exhibits
- 3. Operational Seed Funding

The collaborative nature of our digital strategy expands our reach, and minimizes our expenses. The waterfront property overlooking Charleston is provided by the Patriots Point Development Authority under a long-term lease.
